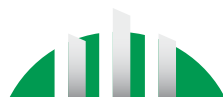

## ORGANISERS

### The Assises des Déchets

The Assises were born in 1991 with the idea to favor thoughts between industrials, local collectivities, administration, the environment protection associations. First conference of that kind, they have been a reference for 20 years in waste universe for confrontation and the exchange of good practices for “greener” waste policies, more responsible, more respectful of the environment.

An association has been created to ensure the organization of this event. It associates the main actors in the world of waste who support the conference and contribute to the enrichment of reflection: administrations, public collectivities, waste producers, elimination and waste recycling professionals, as well as environmental NGO.

The Assises are organised in the form of debates - usually four plenary sessions and eight technical workshops - on themes reflecting the current environmental actuality and the current priorities.

Every two years, nearly a thousand of participants are meeting up and eighty speakers are giving their points of view and exchanging with the room.

The Assises have often been an opportunity for the Minister in charge of the environment to announce important decisions regarding his waste management policy.

### The DREAL network: actor of the Grenelle Environment territorialization and sustainable development policy

The regional directions of the environment, planning and housing, created in 2009 and 2010 from the regional directions of the environment (DIREN), regional directions of equipment (DRE) and regional directions of industries, research and environment (DRIRE) are now the unique pilot, at a regional level, of sustainable development policies.

Under the authority of the region prefect, regional directions of the environment, planning and housing aim at:

- developing and implementing States' policies in terms of environment, sustainable development and planning in the following fields: climat change, natural heritage, sites and landscapes, sustainable planning of territories, transports, security and road trafic, monitoring and security of industrial activities, energy management, environmental knowledge and evaluation...
- developing and implementing States' policies in terms of housing: supply development, urban renovation and fight against indecent housing.
- Ensuring the integration of sustainable development objectives in plans, programs and projects, assisting competent administrative authorities and promoting the citizens participation in the development of projects having an impact on the environment or national planning and development.
- Contributing to the information, the citizens training and education on sustainable development issues and risk prevention through risk awareness.

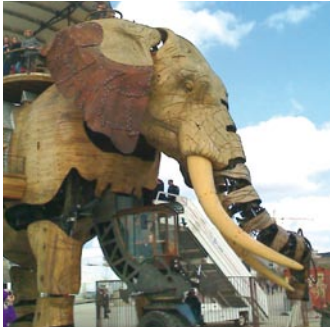

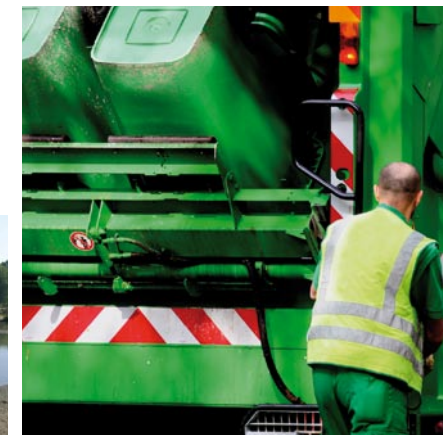

Dredging of rivers, canals, waterways, in seaports (50 m<sup>3</sup> billion per year in France): what to do with those sediments issued from these operations? Those materials have the waste status and are often polluted. They must therefore follow adapted treatment processes. In several regions, the situation is difficult: the most contaminated sediments are often left at the bottom of the rivers, and recovery schemes do not exist, or just a few.

## TW7: WOOD ENERGETIC RECOVERY AT THE END OF ITS LIFE

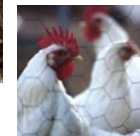
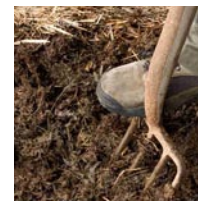

To aim the objective of 23% renewable energies in the final consumption of energy, in 2020 the energy mix will include developing co-generation and fire-box supplied from biomass, including energy recovery from waste wood at the end of its life. An important resource (demolitions, industry, packaging, waste reception centre) but to deal with carefully: how to treat wood with additive or with few non hazardous additive, identify circuits and needed technologies (combustion, fumes treatment), define a strategy for the end of waste status.

The production of radioactives waste of low activity (TFA) is going to increase with the dismantling of the nuclear installations. The storage capacities being limited, operators have to reduce as much as possible the waste production and its volume. What are the actions to reach it? Can we also consider alternative paths to storage, under which conditions? With Andra, the nuclear industry is considering the feasibility of recycling in the nuclear industry scrap metal and concrete TFA.

Is the responsibility of waste producers going too far? If the polluter-pays principle has unanimous support, producing companies face complicated situations: they can pay several times their waste disposal in case of bankruptcy of their suppliers, sometimes leading them to a feeling of almost continuous risk, even if it respects the regulation. Besides the difficulty of maintaining it technically (mixed waste, pre-treated...) the continuity of the chain of responsibility sets heavy financial and legal issues.
