

## PS3. Superposition of plans threatens coherence

Considering the huge volume of waste generated (10 million tons - out of inert waste), waste management is a priority for the region which encourages the reduction of waste generation. The regional council has developed 3 plans to organise the treatment of waste: Predma (household and similar waste), Predas (Infectious clinical waste) and Predd (hazardous waste). The waste from building sites will be subject to a plan in the near future.



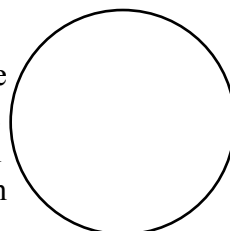
**Mr. Didier IMBERT, managing director - Sita France**

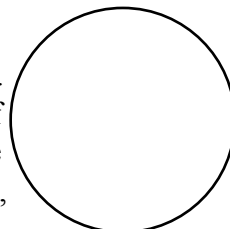
**Mr. Emmanuel MAISTRELLI, consultant - Inddigo**
